

BUSINESS & INDUSTRIAL

From coast to coast, business and industries are arranging for chaplains to provide pastoral care, support, and assistance for their emplyees. Business and industrial chaplains are Christ's ears, eyes, hands, and heart in the workplace.

DISASTER RELIEF

Few areas of chaplaincy require greater sensitivity and a rapid response to needs than a disaster. Disaster relief chaplains extend the witness and care of the church to people whose lives have been unexpectedly interrupted.

FIRST RESPONDER

When there is a fire or other emergency, firemen and/or other emergency rescue personnel respond. Chaplains serve in fire and rescue departments ministering to the responders, their families, and the public they serve. Chaplains are Christ's presence in an emergency.
