FEATURED SPEAKERS



Dr. Ben Mandrell was elected the 10th president of Lifeway Christian Resources on June 28, 2019. As president and CEO, Mandrell provides vision and strategic leadership to the nonprofit organization headquartered in Nashville, Tennessee. Prior to joining Lifeway, he pastored churches in Colorado and Tennessee. A native of Tampico, Illinois, Mandrell graduated from Anderson (Indiana) University in 1998. He also holds a Master of Divinity degree from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Union University in Jackson, Tennessee. Mandrell and his wife, Lynley, have been married since 2001. The couple has four children: Ava, Max, Miles and Jack.



Dr. Bill Hurt is the senior pastor of Pleasant Hill Baptist Church of Columbus, Mississippi. Before coming to Pleasant Hill in 2012, he pastored churches in Alabama, Mississippi, and Kentucky. A native of Cleveland, Mississippi, he graduated from Mississippi College in 1983. He also earned a Master of Divinity degree from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary in New Orleans, Louisiana. Bill's passion is preaching. He is the author of *Start Here – The Beginning Point for Starting a Daily Devotional Life*. He is also an avid runner. Bill and his wife, Tommi Jo, have been married since 1983. They have two daughters: Laura Jo (Grant) Ferguson and Melanie (Morgan) Brashier. Bill and Tommi Jo are the proud grandparents of Will and Miles.



Dr. Josh Braddy serves as the lead pastor of Broadmoor Baptist Church of Madison, Mississippi. He has earned both a Master of Divinity (MDiv) and a Doctor of Ministry (DMin) from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. At the core of his pastoral work is a genuine desire to see the Lord's Church united in its mission – ushering Christ's Kingdom into a world marred by sin, darkness, and despair. His leadership at Broadmoor is characterized by a passionate drive to cultivate an authentic community and clear purpose within the congregation to equip and empower others to know Christ and follow Him.



Dr. Anthony George is the senior pastor of First Baptist Church of Atlanta, Georgia. Having served as the church's associate pastor since 2012, he assumed the lead role at the historic church in 2020 upon the retirement of the church's pastor of over fifty years, the late Dr. Charles Stanley. Before coming to First Baptist Atlanta, George was the senior pastor of Aloma Church in Winter Park, Florida, a suburb of Orlando, for fifteen years. Under his leadership, First Baptist Atlanta launched a weekly live stream of its services at the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic. Since that time, the church's online audience now claims viewers across the United States and its territories as well as in 110 countries of the world. He is a graduate of Criswell College in Dallas, Texas, and earned his master's and doctoral degrees from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in Wake Forest, North Carolina.
