IMPACT Mississippi Romans 15.5-6

First Session – Tuesday Morning

(1) The Combined Baptist University Choirs and Orchestra led in a Call to Worship singing Declare His Glory. (2) President Bill Hurt, Senior Pastor of Pleasant Hill BC, Columbus, called the 188th Annual Meeting of the Mississippi Baptist Convention to order by the sounding of the gavel.

(3) Chad Ball, Senior Pastor, FBC Gautier, voiced the prayer.

(4) Chip Stevens, Senior Pastor, FBC Jackson, welcomed the convention messengers to FBC Jackson.

(5) President Bill Hurt organized the 188th Convention. Michael Weeks, **Recording Secretary and Pastor of** Pleasant Hill BC, Olive Branch, made the MOTION "That the duly elected 474 messengers from the churches who had registered by 8:30 a.m. and those yet to be registered shall constitute the Body of the 188th Annual Convention for the transaction of the business thereof." MOTION SECONDED and PASSED.

(12) Tommy Mitchell, President of the Mississippi Baptist Convention Board and Senior Pastor, Agricola BC,

Lucedale, was recognized to give the Convention Board Report.

(13) First Vice President Scott Hanberry called for nominations for President of the Convention to serve in 2025. Brian Hood, Lead Pastor, Community Point BC, Hernando, nominated Bill Hurt, Senior Pastor, Pleasant Hill BC, Columbus, as President. Seconded from the floor. Nominations ceased. No other nominations were made. Michael Weeks, Recording Secretary, cast the single ballot "All for one and one for all."

(14) President Hurt called on Doug Gunn, Chair of the Constitution & Bylaws Committee and member of FBC Jackson, to make a presentation. **MOTION PASSED**.

Amendment Process for the Mississippi Baptist Convention's <u>Constitution</u> and <u>The Plan of</u> Organization and Action

Article VIII, Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Convention by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present subject to the following four stipulations:

- (1) Notice in writing setting forth the exact wording of the proposed amendment shall have been given at the annual meeting of the Convention of the immediately preceding year;
 - (2) Such proposed amendment shall be published in the Annual and in The Baptist Record, and referred to the standing Committee on Constitution and Bylaws for study and recommendations;
- (3) Such amendment shall be adopted before the last day

of the annual meeting;

(4) A quorum of the messengers shall be present at the time the vote is taken.

Article XXII, Amendments

This Plan of Organization and Action may be amended in the same way as the Constitution proper (see Constitution, Article VIII, Amendments).

Please note: The proposed previously changes were presented during the Tuesday morning session of the 2023 Convention gathering (Oct. 24, 2023). A discussion and vote regarding the same shall occur during the Tuesday morning session of the current Convention Annual Meeting (Oct. 29, 2024).

Presented in 2023, with discussion and vote during the 2024 Convention:

Article V, Convention Institutions, Commissions, Boards and Other Units of Work

The institutions sponsored and supported by the Convention shall be as **EDUCATIONAL** follows: INSTITUTIONS: Mississippi College, Clinton, Mississippi; Blue Mountain College Christian University, Blue Mountain, Mississippi; William Carey College University, Hattiesburg, Mississippi; the School of Allied Health Programs of the Mississippi Baptist Health Systems, Inc., Jackson, Mississippi. HOSPITALS: The Mississippi Baptist Health Systems, Inc., Jackson, Mississippi; and in cooperation with the Arkansas and Tennessee Baptist Conventions, the The Baptist Memorial Health Care

System, Inc., Memphis, Tennessee, in cooperation with the Arkansas and Tennessee Baptist Conventions. CHILD CARE AGENCY: The Baptist Children's Village, Jackson, Mississippi. ...

Article XIX, The Convention Annual

Section 2. One copy of the annual of the Mississippi Baptist Convention shall be mailed provided to each pastor of cooperating church in the state as soon as practicable. after publication.

(15) Chairman Gunn presented the amendment process for MBC Bylaws. Discussion and vote will be taken in the fourth session.

Amendment Process for the Mississippi Baptist Convention's <u>Bylaws</u>

XVI. Amendments

These Bylaws may be suspended or amended in any annual meeting of the Convention by vote of three-fourths of the members present and voting provided notice in writing shall have been given on the preceding day.

VII. Committee on Committees Section 1. The Committee on Committees shall nominate before the last day of the Convention the following standing committees: the Committee on Order of Business, The Baptist Record Advisory Committee, and the Committee on Constitution and Bylaws, and the Committee on Nominations, the Committee on Resolutions, and the Committee on Time, Place, and Preacher.

Section 2. The Committee on Order of Business, The Baptist Record Advisory Committee, and the committee Committee on Constitution and Bylaws shall consist of six members shall serve serving for a three-year term, being ineligible for reelection until at least one year shall have elapsed. Two shall be rotated off each year and two elected. These committees shall elect their own chairman annually. Section 3. The Committee on Nominations, the Committee on Resolutions, and the Committee on Time, Place, and Preacher shall consist of have five members. Their terms of service shall begin at the adjournment of the annual Convention in which they are elected, and they shall serve through the next annual meeting of the Convention.

Section 4. The Committee on Committees shall also nominate at the first session of the Convention a Committee on Resolutions and a Committee on Time, Place, and Preacher. The Committee on Committees shall also nominate other committees as the Convention may direct.

XII. Committee on Resolutions Section -1. The Committee on Committees shall name at each annual meeting of the Convention a Committee on Resolutions of seven members to which committee all resolutions not connected with the reports of boards and commissions shall be referred after such resolutions have been presented without discussion to the Convention. Section 2. The Committee on Resolutions shall report on all resolutions referred to it either with or without recommendations or amendments.

Section 3. All resolutions must be presented in writing to the Convention before adjournment of the third regular session of the annual Convention. Section 1. The Committee on Resolutions shall annually issue a Call for Resolutions prior to the Convention utilizing the Baptist Record and/or additional Convention media outlets. Section 2. The Committee on Resolutions shall receive written resolutions beginning thirty (30) days prior to the first day of the Convention and no later than ten (10) days prior to the first day of the Convention. All submissions will be dated WHEN RECEIVED by the Committee. Section 3. Only members in good standing of churches entitled to send messengers to the annual meeting of

the Mississippi Baptist Convention may submit resolutions. Section 4. The Committee on Resolutions is vested with the authority to combine, title or retitle, and reword submitted resolutions, and to submit resolutions entirely of its own making. Section 5. The Committee on Resolutions' report shall be published in the First Day Bulletin of the Convention.

XIII. Committee on Time, Place, and Preacher

The Committee on Committees shall name in each annual meeting a Committee on Time, Place, and Preacher which committee shall recommend to the Convention the time of the next annual meeting, the place of meeting, and the preacher of the annual sermon; an alternate preacher shall also be named.

(16) The Combined Choirs and Orchestra led in Worship through Music – Find My Peace and At the Name of Jesus.

(17) Rick Blythe, Director, Stewardship and Prayer Ministries, MBCB, gave a report Celebrating 100 Years of the Cooperative Program.

(18) A Disaster Relief video testimony featuring FBC Rolling Fork was presented.

(19) The Combined Choirs and Orchestra led the congregation in singing *Risen Savior*.

(20) Ben Mandrell, President and CEO, Lifeway Christian Resources, Franklin, TN, was introduced to give the Bible Treasures. The theme of his message was "The Most Important Ingredient for Change" from Hebrews 11:1-2.

(22) Pleasant Hill BC Praise Team and Combined Choirs and Orchestra led in Congregational Worship – *Goodness of God*.

(23) Bill Hurt gave the President's
Address entitled "I Sat Alone" from
Jeremiah 15.10-21 and John 16.31-33.
(24) Robbie Savant, Member, FBC
Natchez, led the benediction.

Second Session – Tuesday Afternoon

(25) The Mississippi Singing Churchmen under the direction of Kristopher Smith, led in Worship through Music: Yet Not I But Through Christ in Me, At the Name of Jesus, and He Will Hold Me Fast. (26) Scott Hanberry, First Vice

President and Member of Temple BC, Hattiesburg, called the Second Session to order.

(27) Allegra Brigham, Member, Chester BC, Ackerman, led the prayer.

(28) Lawson Harlow, Pastor, Mercy Hill Church, Olive Branch, read Ecclesiastes 4.9-12.

(29) Ben Mandrell brought Bible Treasures, "The Pure Get to See," from Matthew 5:8.

(30) The Mississippi Singing Churchmen presented a Concert of Praise: *Holy, Holy, Holy, Psalm 150 (Praise the Lord),* and *Jesus Saves*.

(31) President Hurt presided over the Business Session. The number of registered messengers was 697. (32) President Hurt recognized Michael Barnett, Chair of the Budget Committee, and Senior Pastor of FBC Ocean Springs, to present the proposed 2025 Cooperative Program Budget in the amount of \$30,890,325 as presented in the First Day Bulletin. Other members serving on the committee are: Eddie Barlow, Pastor, Boulevard BC, Southaven; Andy Brown, Senior Pastor, FBC Starkville; Andrew Chesteen, Senior Pastor, FBC New Albany; Jon Hood, Pastor, FBC Marks; Mel Howton, Senior Pastor, New Salem BC, Columbus; Roland McMillan, Pastor, Prentiss BC, Prentiss; Danny Smith, Pastor, FBC Tunica; Michael Stevenson, Pastor, FBC Stateline; Dean Stewart, Senior Pastor, LaBelle Haven BC, Olive Branch; and Leon Wallace, Pastor, Siloam BC, Meadville. The discussion and vote will occur during the Wednesday morning Business Session.

(33) President Hurt called for nominations for First Vice President. David Hayes, Senior Pastor, FBC Senatobia was nominated by Jason Reed, Messenger and Senior Pastor, FBC Booneville. Seconded from the floor. There were no other nominations. Michael Weeks, Recording Secretary, cast the single ballot "All for one and one for all." (34) President Hurt called for nominations for the Recording Secretary. Tommy Mitchell, Messenger and Senior Pastor, Agricola BC, Lucedale, made a **MOTION** to elect Michael Weeks, Pastor, Pleasant Hill BC, Olive Branch, as Recording Secretary, and Will McNeese, Pastor, FBC Polkville, as Associate Recording Secretary. No other nominations were made. President Hurt called for a raised ballot. **MOTION PASSED**.

(35) President Hurt called resolutions to be presented.

(36) Brett Frazier, Messenger and Lead Pastor, FBC Columbia, submitted a "Resolution on the Centennial Anniversary of the SBC Cooperative Program."

(37) President Hurt called for miscellaneous business.

(38) Jacob Vollm, Messenger and Pastor, Grace Memorial BC, Gulfport, made a **MOTION** that the Mississippi Baptist Convention authorize a new method of cooperative giving for its churches, allowing churches the option to withhold funds from selected Southern Baptist Convention entities without withdrawing from Cooperative Program support altogether.

SECONDED from the floor. He spoke for the **MOTION**.

(39) Jonathan Greer, Messenger and Pastor, Franklin Creek BC, Moss Point, spoke against the **MOTION**.
(40) Jerry Watts, Messenger and Senior

Pastor, New Hope BC, Foxworth, questioned the nature of making this **MOTION** to the entire body of messengers.

(41) Tommy Mitchell, Messenger and Senior Pastor, Agricola BC, Lucedale, made a **MOTION to Refer** the original **MOTION** to the Mississippi Baptist Convention Board's Executive Committee.

(42) Parliamentarian Gee Ogletree advised the messengers that a 2/3 majority vote would be required to **PASS** the **MOTION to Refer**. President Hurt clarified that the report from the Executive Committee would be presented during next year's Convention.

(43) The Call for the Question on the **MOTION to Refer** was made by Dan Sandlin, Messenger and Pastor, Union

Chapel BC, Clarksdale. **SECONDED** from the floor. Call for the Question was approved by raised ballot.

(44) The **MOTION to Refer** the original **MOTION** to the MBCB Executive Committee was approved by a visible 2/3 vote of messengers present by raised ballot.

(45) A Collegiate Ministry video testimony was presented featuring Christmas in the Delta.

(46) Mike Haight, Executive Pastor of Creative Arts, Broadmoor BC, Madison, led the congregation in singing *Holy Forever, Agnus Dei*, and *Christ Be Magnified*.

(47) President Hurt called the Convention back into business session and asked for nominations for Second Vice President. Shane Freeman, Pastor, Macedonia BC, Petal, was nominated for Second Vice President by Will Wall, Senior Pastor, FBC Meridian. Seconded from the floor. Nominations ceased. No other nominations were made. Michael Weeks, Recording Secretary, cast the single ballot "All for one and one for all."

(48) President Hurt called for miscellaneous business. There was none.

(49) Daniel Hall, Executive Director, Mississippi Baptist Foundation, gave a report.

(50) Kenny Digby, Executive Director, Christian Action Commission, gave a report.

(51) Broadmoor BC Worship Ministry led in Congregational Worship: *The Solid Rock, Firm Foundation,* and *Build My Life*.

(52) Josh Braddy, Senior Pastor,
Broadmoor BC, Madison, delivered the
Convention Sermon from John 15:1-17.
(53) Neil Marsh, Executive Pastor of
Ministry, Broadmoor BC, Madison, led
in the benediction prayer.
