

CATEGORY II

Students in Grades 1-12 who are ready to play from a hymnal (see Sources, Page 1). If a hymnal is used other than one of those listed, the participant must provide a hymnal for the judge. Hymns in this category <u>are not memorized</u>. After selecting a hymn (in advance), the student should be prepared to:

- play the entire hymn through once,
- · without introduction, AS WRITTEN
- not from memory
- · pedal is optional

There is NO singing or directing in Category II.

CATEGORY II-A

Students in Grades 1-12 who are ready to play from a hymnal (see Sources, Page 1). If a hymnal is used other than one of those listed, the participant must provide a hymnal for both the judge and the group leader. Teachers: please practice conducting and singing the hymn while the student plays. Also, have the student prepared to explain their introduction to the group leader before beginning. Hymns in this category are not memorized. After selecting a hymn (in advance), the student should be prepared to:

- play the hymn through once with the pedal (no singing or directing)
- play as written, without an introduction and with the pedal; pause just a second, THEN
- play an appropriate introduction (that has been previously explained to the group leader)
- play the entire first stanza again while using the pedal and following a director as the congregation sings

CATEGORY III

Grades 4-12

Simplified Hymnals ARE NOT an acceptable source for this category)

This is for students who are playing from a hymnal (see Sources, Page 1). If a hymnal is used other than one of those listed, the participant must provide a hymnal for both the group leader and the judge.

It is suggested that the teachers practice conducting the hymn and singing while the student plays. Hymns and arrangements in this category are not memorized. (Be sure to fill in the name of the arranger on the registration form.) After selecting a hymn (in advance), the student should be prepared to:

- 1. Explain the introduction of the hymn to the group leader.
- 2. Play an introduction of the hymn while using the pedal.
- 3. Play through the first verse (using the pedal) while the congregation sings.

Following the hymn portion of this category, the participant will play a 3-4 minute arrangement of the same hymn (not memorized). Number the measures consecutively beginning with the first measure. ANY part of a measure counts as a full measure when numbering. Editing is allowed, if clearly marked. Repeats are not necessary (except for D.C. al fine) and should be clearly marked out if student is not taking them. Adjust measure numbers if needed. Published music is preferred; however, it is acceptable for the student to play his/her own arrangement or a non-published arrangement. In any case, the music must be provided for the judge. No medleys. The participant may have a page turner. See Copyright Information on Page 2.

PARTICIPANTS MAY PLAY PIANO BEFORE PLAYING FOR ADJUDICATION

CATEGORY IV

Simplified Hymnals ARE NOT an acceptable source for this category)

This category is designed for participants in Grades 10-12 who are playing from a hymnal. Should a student choose to play from another hymnal, they must provide a hymnal for both the group leader and the judge. Only superior ratings are acknowledged on the certificate. A superior rating is a score of 8 and above on a scale of 1 to 10. Guidelines are below. **Students below the 9th Grade will not be admitted in this category.**

Every year that a 10th-12th Grade student participates, the following must be completed:

- The accompanying of a hymn (of the student's choosing in advance). Discussed in Section One.
- 2. The playing of an arrangement of the same hymn (4-minute time limit). **Discussed in Section Two.**
- The playing of a piece from standard piano literature (no arrangements or transcriptions). Discussed in Section Three.
- 4. The playing of a proficiency. **Discussed in Section**Four.

An important word to those who are in 9th Grade: These students may participate, but are not encouraged to do so. You must follow the above guidelines with the exception of #4. A proficiency is not required, but if attempted and passed with a superior, credit will be given for completion.

SECTION ONE - HYMN ACCOMPANIMENT

This is a required section for participation in Category IV every year. Hymns in this category are not memorized. It is suggested that the piano teacher practice conducting the hymn in advance while the student plays.

After selecting a hymn in advance, the participant should be prepared to:

- 1. Explain the introduction of the hymn to the group leader.
- 2. Play an introduction of the hymn while using the
- 3. Play through the first verse (using the pedal) while the congregation sings.

OPTIONAL: The hymn accompaniment may include additions (improvisations) appropriate to the character of the hymn.

SECTION TWO - HYMN ARRANGEMENT

Required each year of participation in Category IV.

This is a short arrangement of the same hymn used for accompaniment described in Section One (4-minute time limit). Editing is allowed if clearly marked. See resource list. The participant should:

- Play a short, non-memorized published piano hymn arrangement of the SAME hymn. NO MEDLEYS.
- Provide music for the judge. See Copyright Notice, Page 2.
- Number measures consecutively beginning with the first measure. Any part of a measure counts as a full measure when numbering.

Participant may have a page turner. Non-published arrangements, or one's own arrangement may be played. Music must be provided for the judge in either case. Adjust measure numbers as needed if piece has been edited.

SECTION THREE - SELECTION FROM TRADITIONAL PIANO LITERATURE

Required each year of participation in Category IV. Please use the following as a guideline to make your selection. There is a 4-minute time limit. The student should prepare to:

- Play a short selection from traditional piano literature.
 Original works by composers; no transcriptions or arrangements. Do not take repeats except D.C. al fine.
- · Play this piece from MEMORY.
- · Provide music for the judge.
- · Number the measures beginning with the first measure.

Special note about photocopied music (not music purchased online): Photocopying permission should be granted by the publisher and marked clearly on the music or attached to the book or piece. **We do not encourage the practice of using photocopied music.**Should this occur, the adjudicator is well within their right to mention that an original should have been presented for adjudication. Since this does not affect their overall presentation, points should not be deducted.

SECTION IV - PROFICIENCIES

If you are in 10th-12th Grade and are participating in Category IV, it is necessary for you to complete a proficiency each year so that you will have completed all three proficiencies by the 12th Grade. You must register for a different proficiency each year.* When a superior rating is achieved on a proficiency, you have completed it, and it is not repeated. You must pass all three proficiencies with a superior rating in order to be eligible for the college scholarship (see Page 11 for other scholarship eligibility requirements). If you have completed all of your proficiencies with a superior rating before the 12^{th} grade, it is not necessary to register for one. Please call the festivals coordinator if you are unsure of your proficiency completion status (contact information, Page 1). If a student in 9th Grade attempts a proficiency and passes with a superior score, credit will be given for completing the proficiency.

Only Superior ratings are acknowledged on the certificate. A Superior rating is a score of 8 and above on a scale of 1-10.

<u>Sight-reading Proficiency:</u> If you choose this proficiency, you must be prepared to do the following:

- 1. Sight-read a hymn from a prepared list.
- Sight-read a choral anthem that has been selected by the festival coordinator. You must be prepared to play the vocal parts OR the accompaniment. There will be NO singing or directing. The judge will decide which you will play, and how much of the anthem you will play.
- 3. You may have a page turner, no one else may accompany you to the proficiency room.

*If a proficiency is not passed with a superior score, it must be repeated.

Accompanying Proficiency: If you choose this proficiency, you must be prepared to do the following:

 Play the accompaniment or vocal parts of an anthem (title below) while a music director leads. NO SINGING.

You may have a page turner. No one else may accompany you to the proficiency room.

The judge will not only determine the amount of this anthem that you will play, but also whether you will play the vocal parts or accompaniment or some of both. Be prepared to start and/or end anywhere in this piece.

This is a piece that you have prepared ahead of the festival. Please bring your own music with you to the festival. It is helpful if you cut apart the anthem and place it in a 3-ring notebook. The judge and group leader are provided music by the keyboard festival coordinator.

MODULATION-TRANSPOSITION PROFICIENCY

- 1. The <u>participant</u> selects one of the hymns below and prepares it in advance. It is played as it written. Play the first stanza of the selected hymn, play a short appropriate modulation to the new key, then play the first stanza again maintaining the four-part harmony in the new key. <u>Be prepared to modulate each hymn **up and down**</u>. The judges will determine which of the two you will play.
- 2. DO NOT WRITE OUT THE NEW HYMN AND BRING IT TO PLAY AT THE FESTIVAL. This proficiency is not to test your notation ability. It is to evaluate your ability to modulate and transpose. You must play a modulation to the new key.

BASIC ORGAN

Student may play from any Hymnal or the Organ edition of the 1991 or 2008 Hymnals (see Page 1). If another hymnal is used, participant must provide a hymnal for the judge and the group leader. The participant should be prepared to explain their introduction to the group leader before beginning. Suggested: Teachers please practice conducting the hymn while the student plays.

Students in Grades 5-12 may register for Basic Organ.

After the participant has chosen a hymn in advance to play, he/she should prepare to do the following:

 Play the first stanza, NOT from memory, with Soprano, Alto, Tenor vocal parts on a manual, and Bass vocal part on pedals.

THEN ...

- 2. Play the same hymn
 - · WITH an appropriate introduction
 - · WITH voicing as listed above
 - FOLLOWING a music director as the congregation sings

ADVANCED ORGAN

This category is designed for participants in Grades 10-12, who are playing from a hymnal. (See Sources, Page 1) Should a student choose to play from another hymnal, they must provide a hymnal for both the group leader and the judge. Guidelines are below. Only Superior ratings are acknowledged on the certificate. A Superior rating is a score of 8 and above on a scale of 1 to 10. **Students below**9th Grade will not be admitted to this category.

Every year that a student in Grades 10-12 participates, the following must be completed:

- The accompanying of a hymn of the student's choosing. Discussed in Section One.
- The playing of an arrangement of the same hymn (4-minute time limit). NO MEDLEYS. See resource list.
 Discussed in Section Two.
- The playing of a piece from standard organ literature (no arrangements or transcriptions). Discussed in Section Three.
- 4. The playing of a proficiency. **Discussed in Section**Four.

An important word to those who are in 9th Grade: These students may participate, but are not encouraged to do so. You must follow the above guidelines with the exception of #4. A proficiency is not required. If a student in 9th Grade attempts a proficiency and passes with a superior score, credit will be given for completing the proficiency.

SECTION ONE - HYMN ACCOMPANIMENT

This is a required section for participation in Advanced Organ every year. Hymns in this category are not memorized. It is suggested that the piano teacher practice conducting the hymn while the student plays.

After selecting a hymn in advance, the participant should be prepared to:

- 1. Explain the introduction of the hymn to the group leader.
- Play an introduction of the hymn with Soprano, Alto and Tenor vocal parts on a manual and the Bass vocal part on the pedals.
- Play through the first verse as described above while the congregation sings.

SECTION TWO - HYMN ARRANGEMENT

Required each year of participation in Advanced Organ. This is a short arrangement of the same hymn used for accompaniment described in Section One (4-minute time limit). Editing is allowed if clearly marked. The participant should:

- Play a short, non-memorized, published hymn arrangement for organ. See Resources List.
- · Provide music for the judge.
- Number measures consecutively, beginning with first measure. Any part of a measure counts as a full measure when numbering.

Published music is preferred; however, it is acceptable for the student to play his/her own arrangement or a non-published arrangement. In either case, music must be provided for the judge. NO MEDLEYS. The participant may have a page turner. Adjust measure numbers as needed if piece has been edited.

- Play a short non-memorized selection from traditional organ literature.
- · Provide music for the judge.
- · Number the measures beginning with the first measure.

The participant may have a page turner. **Please use original works by composers, no transciptions or arrangements.** Do not take repeats except D.C. al fine. Suggested resources can be found on Page 8.

SECTION IV - PROFICIENCIES

If you are in 10th-12th Grade and are participating in Advanced Organ, you must complete a proficiency each year so that you will have completed all three proficiencies by the 12th Grade.

You must register for a different proficiency each year.*
When a superior rating is achieved on a proficiency, you have completed it. You must pass all three proficiencies with a superior rating in order to be eligible for the college scholarship (see Page II for other scholarship eligibility requirements). If you have completed all of your proficiencies with a superior rating before the 12th grade, it is not necessary to register for one. Please call the festivals coordinator if you are unsure of your proficiency completion status (contact information, Page I). If a 9th Grade student attempts a proficiency and passes with a superior score, credit will be given for completing the proficiency.

*If a proficiency is not passed with a superior score, it must be repeated.

Only Superior ratings are acknowledged on the certificate. A Superior rating is a score of 8 and above on a scale of 1-10.

Sight-reading Proficiency: If you choose this proficiency, you must be prepared to do the following:

- 1. Sight-read a hymn. Be prepared to use your pedal.
- Sight-read a choral anthem that has been selected by the festival coordinator. Pedal will be used on accompaniment.
- You must be prepared to play the vocal parts or the accompaniment. There will be NO singing or directing. The judge will select which you will play and how much of the anthem you will play.

The participant may have a page turner. No one else may accompany you to the proficiency room.

Accompanying Proficiency: If you choose this proficiency, you must be prepared to play the accompaniment or vocal parts of an anthem (title below) while a music director leads. NO SINGING.


You may have a page turner. No one else may accompany you to the proficiency room.

The judge will not only determine the amount of this anthem that you will play, but also whether you will play the vocal parts or accompaniment or some of both. Be prepared to start and/or end anywhere in this piece.

This is a piece that you have prepared ahead of the festival. Please bring your own music with you to the festival. It is helpful if you cut apart the anthem and place it in a 3-ring notebook. The judge and group leader are provided music by the keyboard festival coordinator.

MODULATION-TRANSPOSITION PROFICIENCY

- 1. The <u>participant</u> selects one of the hymns below and prepares it in advance. It is played as it written. Play the first stanza of the selected hymn, play a short appropriate modulation to the new key, then play the first stanza again maintaining the four-part harmony in the new key. <u>Be prepared to modulate each hymn **up and down**. The judges will determine which of the two you will play.</u>
- 2. DO NOT WRITE OUT THE NEW HYMN AND BRING IT TO PLAY AT THE FESTIVAL. This proficiency is not to test your notation ability. It is to evaluate your ability to modulate and transpose. You must play a modulation to the new key.

If you are a senior and have completed all of the necessary requirements (outlined on Pages 5-6 for Piano and Pages 7-8 for Advanced Organ) for a college scholarship, contact the Keyboard Festival Coordinator (info on Page 1) to declare your intent to apply for the scholarship.

- A) One-time award of \$200 from Worship Ministries to the school of your choice in Mississippi. You do not have to major in music or keyboard, but must take piano or organ in the first semester to receive this scholarship. Only William Carey University, Mississippi College, and Blue Mountain College are set up to match this scholarship, providing the scholarship award limit has not been reached. The student's home church is also encouraged to match the scholarship as well. The student should request this in writing and provide the church's contact information to Wyndy South.
- B) Ralph M. Taylor Keyboard Scholarship Requirements: Piano or Organ Major, or Music Major with a piano or organ emphasis. Qualified persons should complete the application on Page 11 of this booklet. Along with your application, please include (separately) a paragraph declaring your major and chosen instrument (piano/organ), and a few sentences about why you have chosen this major and how you believe that this will help you accomplish your goals or fulfill your ministry objectives.
